This past season has seen us continue to gel as a one-club organization with success in many areas both on and off the pitch and at this point I wish to record my gratitude to both club volunteers and sponsors. These two areas are the keys to success in the modern world and without them we cannot progress. Progress has been made despite the blight the impact of the Relief Road has had on the club. No doubt this will be discussed in more detail later in the meeting, but I would like to emphasize that our volunteer base is finite and that much time and trouble has been devoted to dealing with ensuing issues – resources that could have been better spent on club development.

It is a measure of the club's strength that we have continued to develop despite this. Our watershed came three or four years ago with the combination of ground subsidence and injury litigation, but when it was all over we looked at each other and

came to the conclusion that if we could survive such turpitudes then we had core strength to take us forward and that has proved correct.

### Club Growth (Membership)

Membership has increased throughout all areas of the club from Mini and youth through to seniors.

We have playing teams in all ages from under 7's through to a combined 14's and 15's.

All teams have the support of pro-active team managers and excellent coaches.

With the increase in adult playing numbers, a 3<sup>rd</sup> XV team has tried to accommodate games with teams playing within the D&W South 3 league, to enable all players to get playing time. This has had limited success, with many opposition teams pulling out at the last moment.

The club has been active in trying to support rugby within the community and through its schools links programme, and has provided coaching and assistance at a number of schools events. Community rugby has taken the form of support with CPSO's, adult tag and beach rugby, which culminated in an excellent scrum on the beach with the RFU and O2.

### Club awards and members achievements.

The club was awarded runner up prize, and regional prize for D&W and South of England in the presidents XV awards, for Seal of Approval, and second prize overall in the technology award category.

The club has also seen many new coaches successfully completing their rugby ready and child welfare courses. Congratulation also to 3 new referees: Pabs, Louis and Calum.

### Club Development facilities and equipment.

The club has had a challenging year with regard to its playing facilities and pitches. Firstly I would like to take this opportunity of thanking John Lloyd for his liaison with Wey valley and for Barry work in keeping the lights working.

I acknowledge that this has been less than satisfactory, but would like to thank you all for your cooperation.

At last in December, we managed to get back onto our home pitches for games, and this had a huge impact on revenue through the club, and a better club

feeling. This was more so with our mini and youth rugby teams. Again, thank you for all those people that trudged up to Wey valley, with training kit and catering.

### **Outside improvements**

The club has an increased playing area to the front of the club house, which through care, should be an excellent benefit to the club in the future.

We have a fence, which has had limited success in keeping dogs and people off the playing surface. We also have now, a wooden fence to the front of the club, which improves the area, and allows glasses to be taken out onto the picnic area. This fence has been paid for by the advertising boards attached. The plan is to build the fence, the length of the car park over the summer period.

The club has a new disabled access to the rear of the club, which also doubles up as a wooden deck.

### **Inside the club**

The club benefitted from a lottery grant coupled with the very kind donations and support of Stuart Barnes to rebuild the toilet facilities at the club. This was coupled with the provision of disabled toilet facilities and decorated cross passage.

Other improvements are new doors, windows to the rear of the club house and white walls.

The club was also donated two 42 inch televisions, which will improve coaching sessions and entertainment within the club.

A special thank you to Stephen Calbraith for his hard work on club branding and all Sponsors for their support.

#### (iii) Mini & Youth

Firstly please accept my apologies for not being able to attend this meeting as it falls on my youngest son's birthday.

Secondly please also accept my further apologies for not being able to have had much input and indeed spare much time this season to devote to the mini and youth sub-committee, I did try to seek a replacement earlier in the season without I am afraid any success. Unfortunately work and professional qualification commitments took up and continue to take up all my spare time.

Regards the season and the M&Y section, one meeting was held early on in the season, which was attended by the younger sides (12 and below), this was mainly due to those age groups being present at the club on a training day. The older sides, as you are aware, were mainly playing and training on different days at different locations thus making regular contact difficult (I did however try to remain in contact via e-mail, but unfortunately this approach did not really work).

The season started with reasonably good numbers throughout most age groups, with large numbers being noted in the U6 and U7 & 8's which is mainly due to the excellent work done by the coaches, and of course the best advertisement – word of mouth between the parents. Initially matches and training took place at Wey Valley School, from which I have not really had any negative feedback from coaches/TM's and parents other than toilet facilities and lack of tea/bacon rolls, but given our pitch situation or rather lack of pitches this option was successful in keeping most of us together and providing pitches for the M&Y section to train and play matches. So thank you to all involved in organizing this for the M&Y section. The freezing weather we endured and associated cancellation of training and matches does not appear to have affected the long term attendance of the majority of our members.

The number of coaches throughout all age groups seems to have increased dramatically, and it is noticeable that many more helpers have been dragged in from the side lines and the clubhouse to assist, so thank you to all of them. Actions like this can only strengthen our M&Y section and lighten the load on the few.

Particular increases in numbers were seen with the U6 and U7 & 8 age groups. The U6's Team Manager tells me that they now have circa 50 players, with the U7 & 8's registering circa 28 players. This is excellent news for the club and hopefully provides our players of the future. Thanks for this must go to the coaches, Andy Martin, Chris Calton and Steve Hunter for the U7 & 8's and of course Steve Hayward and Pete Brown for the U6's, for their time, dedication and ability to attract new players almost every week, which I am informed has mainly been due to parents recommending the club to other parents.

I was able to attend the Dorset Chairs (M&Y sections) meetings on behalf of WRFC. These meetings were arranged by Marcus Monier-Williams of Swans, with the major 11 clubs in Dorset all attending. The Dorset Chairs meetings were brought about by Marcus's feeling that the ethos of M&Y rugby was being lost in Dorset. The meetings have provided an excellent forum for clubs to speak to each other, share problems and even solutions, with a main aim this year to organize a 'structured season'. The idea of the structured season is that we would all agree to a fixtures schedule drawn up arranging 1 fixture between all sides, with then the option for individual clubs to arrange further fixtures to suit themselves, with certain dates such as Mother's day, Easter and Remembrance Sunday excluded. WRFC was represented at the fixtures meeting by Gary Baynham-Jones, and I am sure he will expand further on this matter if required. The Chairs meetings are held approximately every quarter at various clubs around the county and I do feel it is important for Weymouth to continue to be represented there.

This season's PGL trip was a reasonable success, with perhaps the economic downturn and distance to venue being the negatives. A big thank you should go to Sally Chittick for arranging finances and many, many other things and of course Denise Davis for room allocation and the Halloween party. Another trip is being organized for the new season by Jason and Karen Weston, this time to Osmington, and will again be over the Halloween weekend.

In general the season progressed well, although I did receive a few complaints and grumbles towards the end of the season about the number of matches/touring teams visiting in the last month or so of the season and the pitch allocation. The U6's seemed to suffer the most with pitch allocation, often being pushed in between older age groups involved in matches, and being asked to end sessions early to facilitate matches for older teams. I know this has mainly been due to the pitch size, but I must add that these are a large group bringing not only players but much needed funds to the club and should be treated fairly and kept informed of arrangements.

We were pleased to see the Mayor at the end of season event, and very pleased she took the time to go round the pitches meeting coaches and players. With regards to the actual awards, the feedback I have received on the day highlighted disappointment that the Clubman trophy had been dropped. Also the issuing of certificates, not small trophies, caused a few complaints - one parent has offered to sponsor the return of the trophies for his son's age group next year!

The only other areas of concern mentioned to myself was that the final day was not a training day where parents could join in the fun and games and that the awards were just tagged on at the end of the matches detracting from the purpose of recognizing every players efforts and achievements throughout the season.

Not wishing to end moaning the M&Y section would like to thank everyone at the club for ensuring we could play rugby this year and give congratulations to the club for the improvements made to the facilities, this I can report has gone down well, especially with the ladies, and finally give special thanks to Chris and Glyn for everything they have done and continue to do.

Thank you to Alison Hunter for checking 13 months of accounts prior to today. New accounts are been done on sage which is more accurate. Profit for the year was £912.96. Julian explained that he will look at the fixed assets and correct, next season will see changes as most items will be depreciated and written off. CD & JO are working on recoding the accounts so that more detailed reports & costings will be available. Brian Wilkes asked if the Office equipment is the clubhouse, yes. JO explained opening new Bank Account which will help with everything and reduce banking charges. Bar Sales are up and mistakes of the past now do not exist. CD explained that the club will be looking at costing everything and looking for cheaper deals wherever possible. Food sales where very good well done Denise Davis especially that we were not at the club all season. JO will be sorting gift aid claims including M & Y membership. It was explained that membership can often be put into the wrong pot due to the correct info not been provided. JL asked where any RFF money appeared; JO explained that this was in the accounts. Waste costs had been reduced from 3k per annum to 1 k. AH was checking accounts randomly which will save 1.5 k per annum. JO explained if we went above 80 k then we will need to have a full audit (as required by Audit Commission) and we would have to look to register for VAT
